Taylor Swift Announces Second Re-Recorded Album Will Be 'Red (Taylor's Version)'

Taylor Swift announced that the next phase of her re-release project will be *Red (Taylor's Version)*. The newest album will be available everywhere on Nov. 19.

"In the land of heartbreak, moments of strength, independence, and devil-may-care rebellion are intricately woven together with grief, paralyzing vulnerability and hopelessness. Imagining your future might always take you on a detour back to the past. And this is all to say, that the next album I'll be releasing is my version of *Red*," she announced via social media.

Red, Swift's Grammy-nominated and award-winning album, was originally released in 2012 and included a plethora of hit singles for the artist, including "We Are Never Ever Getting Back Together," "I Knew You Were Trouble," "22," "Everything Has Changed" with **Ed Sheeran**, the album's title track "Red," and fan-favorite "All Too Well." After its release in October of 2012,



the project spent seven weeks at the top of the *Billboard* 200, making Swift the first female artist—and the second act since the Beatles—to have three consecutive albums each spend at least six weeks at No. 1. *Red*, Swift's fourth studio album, was also certified 7x Platinum.

With such an impressive list of accolades associated with the original album, Swift will be taking on quite a feat as she reimagines the effort. This will be the second re-release Swift will deliver, after having released *Fearless* (*Taylor's Version*) in April. Fearless (*Taylor's Version*) featured re-recorded versions of all 19 tracks from the 2008 edition of *Fearless*, in addition to Swift's 2010 single "Today Was a Fairytale," and six additional songs not included on the original album. The re-recorded version of *Fearless* reached No. 1 on the *Billboard* 200 chart, and became the first re-recorded album to ever do so.

"Like trying on pieces of a new life, I went into the studio and experimented with different sounds and collaborators," Swift writes of *Red (Taylor's Version)*. "And I'm not sure if it was pouring my thoughts into this album, hearing thousands of your voices sing the lyrics back to me in passionate solidarity, or if it was simply time, but something was healed along the way."

Swift also told fans that *Red (Taylor's Version)* will include 30 tracks, all of which were meant to go on the original project. *MR*

Carly Pearce Invited To Join The Grand Ole Opry



Carly Pearce has been invited to be the latest Grand Ole Opry Member by the iconic Opry Member Dolly Parton. The invite happened off the Opry stage late last week, and the public announcement was held until Pearce's Opry appearance on June 22 so she could experience the moment on the hallowed stage.

It was a full circle moment for the CMA and double ACM Award winner, who cut her teeth as a performer at Dollywood when she was a teenager. When the invitation was extended as seen in the video, Pearce though she was taping a promotion for the theme park. This is the first time Parton has asked someone to become a member of country's longest running institution.

After the invitation video played for the packed Opry House, the crowd stood in applause as Carly expressed, "Truly this is the most precious place and the most precious family I could ever be a part of. I've experienced so many wonderful things in my career so far, but this takes the cake!"

"When one of ours has a special moment, it's an honor to be part of that," Parton said. "Carly is a real songwriter and bright heart – and I loved getting to ask her to do something so very special."

For Pearce, who has played the Grand Ole Opry 85 times, it was a moment she will never forget.


"[The Opry has] been the greatest love of my life since I was a young girl listening with my grandparents. All of the greatest writers, legends and pioneers have been on that stage, and I feel them in my bones anytime I walk in the stage door... To actually be asked to join the Opry family, there are no words," Pearce said.

"Carly Pearce and the Opry have enjoyed a most special relationship since even before she made her Opry debut," said Opry Executive Producer **Dan Rogers**. "We've loved every minute of watching her star grow over the past few years and are thankful she reveres the Opry after more than 80 appearances even more than she did on her first night with us. Every night she plays the Opry, I try to make my way back to her to thank her for taking the time to visit us. Every single time she replies, 'It's my favorite place to be.' Here's to the Opry being Carly's favorite place to be for the rest of what will no doubt be a long, successful career."

Pearce will be officially inducted on Tuesday, Aug. 3. MR

Country Music Hall Of Fame And Museum To Open New Martina McBride Exhibit



Martina McBride's three-decade career will be highlighted in a new Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum exhibit, Martina McBride: The Power of Her Voice, opening July 30 through Aug. 7, 2022.

The exhibit encompasses the singer's journey from her formative years performing in her family's band as a child to becoming an award-winning country artist with an enduring career. Known for hits including "Independence Day" and "A Broken Wing," the Kansas native released her major label debut in 1992 and had her first top ten on the *Billboard* country chart in 1993 with "My Baby Loves Me." Inspired by forerunners such as Linda Ronstadt, Reba McEntire, and Connie Smith, McBride helped further modernize the image of female artists in country music, choosing material that often highlighted women's strengths.

McBride's second album, The Way That I Am crossed the million-seller plateau in May 1995 and began a streak of Platinum albums stretching into the 2000's. She won four CMA Female Vocalist of the Year awards, three consecutively (1999, 2002-2004), and three consecutive ACM Top Female Vocalist honors from 2001-2003, and in November of 1995, she became a member of the Grand Ole Opry. After years of crossover pop success, McBride returned to her roots in traditional country with her 2005 album, Timeless, and albums that followed from 2007 to 2016 reached the Top Five on the country album chart. In 2015, she became a lead voice in combatting the dwindling airplay given to female country artists, and the Academy of Country Music presented her with the Cliffie Stone Icon Award in 2019 for her contributions to country music. MR

Hang Your Hat Music, a creative joint venture with Concord Music Publishing founded by two-time ACM Songwriter of the Year **Hillary Lindsey**, has signed two Nashville-based songwriters and artists, **Ben Chapman** and **Meg McRee**, to worldwide publishing deals.

"When we were talking about forming Hang Your Hat Music, Jake played me some of Ben's music they were working on and I was instantly drawn in and intrigued," says Lindsey. "I love real people, and real people are hard to find but without even meeting Ben, I was in because he's so authentic with who he is as a person as well as with his artistry. When we finally did speak on the phone during quarantine, I fell in love with him even more. Then after getting to write with Ben, I knew my gut was right—damn what a talent! The second time we wrote together, Ben pulled in Meg, and within an hour of writing with her, I was all in as well. Meg is so smart with her lyrics, thoughtful with the way she writes, can sing her face off and I knew she was the real deal too. I'm so excited for them to be a part of the Hang Your Hat family—and to see how this next chapter unfolds for them."

Originally from LaFayette, Georgia, Chapman started playing in bars at the age of 17, where he piqued the interest of a few seasoned Nashville songwriters. His music is heavily inspired by the smooth groove and hard-hitting sounds of the '70s, pulling inspirations from bands like the Allman Brothers, Little Feat, and Hank Williams, Jr. and songwriting legends Guy Clark and Roger Miller.

"I feel so fortunate to be working with a team that encourages me to find my own sound and write songs that are authentic to me," says Chapman. "From the short time I've worked with Hang Your Hat and Concord it already feels like family."

Chapman and McRee are both working on their debut albums, which are scheduled to be released later this year. Chapman is working alongside Hang Your Hat Music GM, **Jake Gear**, who serves as lead producer on the album.

Hailing from Sugar Hill, Georgia, McRee began her music journey at the age of five, learning to play classical violin and also teaching herself guitar. She attended Vanderbilt University, where she discovered her pull towards music, and pursued multiple internships on Music Row in Nashville. McRee stays true to the tradition of country music, creating fresh sounds and lyrics, all while honoring her southern beliefs.

"Hang Your Hat and Concord felt like the perfect home for me from the start," says McRee. "I'm thrilled and honored to get to work with the best publishers and songwriters in the industry so early in my career." *MR*



Acclaimed Nashville Songwriter Ross Copperman Finds Artist Voice Again [Interview]

With 30 No. 1 country songs to his credit, **Ross Copperman** is a well-known name on Music Row. He's been a part of massive country hits with Kenny Chesney, Dierks Bentley, Keith Urban, Darius Rucker and more. He's earned numerous songwriter awards, including two CMA Triple Play Awards and an ACM Songwriter of the Year win. Additionally, Copperman's production work has garnered him several Grammy nominations.

While his work in the country space has no doubt kept him busy, Copperman's musical story started in 2006 as an artist signed to the UK-based Photogenic Records—where Natasha Bedingfield was signed at the time. While he had success with pop-rock songs "As I Choke" and "All She Wrote," Copperman felt the pull to something different.



"I did a lot of touring and making records—I did my time in the UK and I got burned out on being an artist when I was younger. I didn't know what I was doing," Copperman tells *MusicRow*.

With a need for a new direction, Copperman returned home to the United States and headed to Music City. "I knew that I was a songwriter first and I knew that Nashville was the Mecca of songwriting. I also knew that the way I wrote songs was in a very Nashville-style way of writing songs. So I came here and was embraced by the community immediately. I found people that loved songwriting as much as I did. I fell in love with it like everyone else that comes here and falls in love with it."

Now, with nearly 20 years of success as a hit songwriter under his belt, Copperman is returning to the artist spotlight.

"That desire was always there. It never went away, I just buried it for a long time," Copperman says. "The pandemic happened and I was like, 'If I'm going to do it, this would be the time to do it.' It gave me the time to be able to focus on it, and I found a team that believed in me and my music. That was a huge part of it, finding people that actually believed in what I was doing."

Copperman signed with Photo Finish Records, and in May released his first EP in years, *Somewhere There's a Light On.* The five-track project features piano-driven pop songs, with lyrical concepts that nod to Copperman's country repertoire.

"I started writing these songs years ago, I've really always been writing these songs. I had the session with **Ed Sheeran** and we wrote 'Electricity' and 'Therapy' in the same day. I fell in love with those two songs, I was secretly hoping nobody would cut them. A year and a half passed and I played them for every artist in town because I was so excited," Copperman says. "It just didn't fit in country music. I finally asked Ed for his blessing to put them out myself and he was so gracious and supportive. That was a huge turning point for me."

The title track for the project is an ethereal pop ballad with a fascinating bass drop, and finds Copperman singing the comforting message: "Take your time, feed your soul, if you ever find yourself alone, and you need a place that feels like home, somewhere there's a light on."



"The message behind that song is everything I stand for as an artist, reminding people that there's good out there and no matter how hard your day is, somebody else is experiencing the same thing somewhere. Somewhere there's a light on for you"

"Alex Mendoza, who co-produced this record with me, really helped me find my sound. My having produced so many albums, I felt like I needed that outside voice to help guide me. I wanted to be the artist in this scenario, I didn't want to be producing myself, "Copperman says of the project's unique sound. "Alex brought perspective and was able to see it from 30,000 feet, whereas when you are the artist and you're making music, it's hard to see it from a different perspective. He brought a young energy to it, which really suited the songs. And he just brought perspective for me to be like, 'Let's do a drop here after this chorus.' That's my dream, to do songs with drops—I know how to make a country drop, but I don't know how to do a legit pop drop."

While Copperman admits he is a songwriter first, he's excited to return to his own artistry.

"My dream is to ultimately play theaters, to get to that point where I can do theaters. I'm going to continue to just put out songs, I have more lined up to come this year," Copperman sums. "I just want to continue to grow it and to give it all I have with a new sense of grounding." **MR**
