# Billy Strings, The War & Treaty Among Americana Honors & Awards Winners

Another Americana Honors & Awards ceremony is in the books, with Tyler Childers taking home the night's coveted Album Of The Year award for his project *Can I Take My Hounds to Heaven?* at this year's 22nd annual event.

During the awards, which took place last night (Sept. 20) at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville, **Billy Strings** received the Artist Of The Year nod—celebrating back-to-back wins in the category—and **The War And Treaty** also notched their second trophy for Duo/Group of the Year, as well.

**Bonnie Raitt**'s "Just Like That" took home Song of the Year honors during the ceremony, and **S.G. Goodman** was named Emerging Act of the Year. Instrumentalist of the Year went to **SistaStrings**, comprised of sisters **Chauntee** and **Monique Ross**.

Highlights from the evening included **Patty Griffin** accepting the Lifetime Achievement Award for Songwriting from presenter **Sarah Silverman**. **Allison Russell** was given the Spirit of Americana/Free Speech in Music Award from First Amendment Center's **John Seigenthaler** and local lawmakers **Gloria Johnson**, **Justin Jones** and **Justin Pearson**, putting her in the same company with Joan Baez, Jackson Browne, Johnny Cash and Mavis Staples, who have all formerly received the award.

The Avett Brothers and Nickel Creek were also honored with Trailblazer Awards during the evening by two-time Americana Music



# Maren Morris 'Freely Moving Forward' Beyond Country Music



Maren Morris is entering her next era of music in a new phase, "honoring where [she's] been and what [she's] achieved in country music, but also freely moving forward."

The Grammy winner expressed her feelings about the next step of her journey with the release of a two-track EP, The Bridge. The project's new tracks include "The Tree," produced by **Greg Kurstin**, and "Get the Hell Out of Here," produced by Jack Antonoff with Morris and Jimmy Robbins. Morris co-wrote both songs with Robbins and Laura Veltz.

The new music is released via Columbia Records out of New York, migrating Morris from Sony Music Nashville to the mainstream imprint.

Photo: Morgan Foitle About *The Bridge,* Morris shares, "These two songs are incredibly key to my next step because they express a very righteously angry and liberating phase of my life these last couple of years but also how my navigation is finally pointing towards the future, whatever that may be or sound like. Honoring where I've been and what I've achieved in country music, but also freely moving forward.

"'The Tree' is about a toxic 'family tree' burning itself to the ground. Halfway through, I realize it's burning itself down without any of my help. This song evokes the pain of exhausting all your love and time for this person or 'entity' but realizing it's just a draining, transactional relationship that isn't nourishing in any healthy way. By the end of the song, I give myself permission to face the sun, plant new seeds where it's safer to grow and realize that sometimes there IS greener grass elsewhere."

She adds, "Get the Hell Out of Here' is the part two to the tree burning. Being guite literally burned out, this is a story of me feeling pulled in every direction, needing everyone else's understanding and acceptance but my own and how self-destructive that ultimately became. I relinquish control of trying to change everyone's mind or bad behavior and focus on my own power going forward. Doing the right thing can feel lonely at times, but there are more friends than foes, so I finally guit making myself one of them."

Since impacting country music in 2016 with her debut single "My Church," Morris has released three critically acclaimed albums, 2016's Hero, 2019's Girl and 2022's Humble Quest.

In addition to a Grammy win and 17 nominations. Morris has won five ACM Awards, five CMA Awards and three Billboard Music Awards, with several additional wins and nominations. She's broken streaming records and celebrated hits such as "80's Mercedes", "I Could Use a Love Song," "Rich," "Girl," "The Bones," "Circles Around This Town" and more, as well as her six-time Platinum collaboration with Zedd, "The Middle."

Morris is about to wrap her arena tour with **The Chicks** in Canada, following a run of European dates and a sold-out headline show at London's O2 Forum Kentish Town earlier this summer. MR



# The Oak Ridge Boys Announce Farewell Tour

**The Oak Ridge Boys** are celebrating their 50th anniversary as a group this October. To commemorate the occasion, the Country Music Hall of Famers will hit the road on their "American Made: Farewell Tour!"

The tour will celebrate the momentous accomplishments of the Grammy-winning group's **Duane Allen**, **Joe Bonsall**, **William Lee Golden** and **Richard Sterban**.

"We are doing a farewell tour because we owe it to our fans to say goodbye," shares Golden. "They have always been there for us through the good times and the bad. I will always be thankful to every person who came out to a show, bought a t-shirt, played our

music, and overall, loved us enough to spend their hard-earned money whenever they could. This tour is for you!"

The group originally formed as the Oak Ridge Quartet on the '40s, becoming popular in southern gospel during the '50s. They changed their name to The Oak Ridge Boys in the early '60s, with Golden joining in '65 and Allen in '66. They remained a gospel group until the mid-1970s, when they changed their image and concentrated on country music. Sterban joined the hit-making line-up in '72 and Bonsall in '73.

Throughout their career, The Oak Ridge Boys have sold over 41 million units worldwide. In addition to their awards and accolades in country music, the Oaks have garnered five Grammy Awards, nine GMA Dove Awards and two American Music Awards. In addition to the Country Music Hall of Fame, they are members of the Grand Ole Opry, the Gospel Music Hall of Fame and the Vocal Group Hall of Fame.

The Oaks have achieved 17 No. 1 hits, including "Leaving Louisiana In The Broad Daylight," "Bobbie Sue," "Trying To Love Two Women," "(I'm Settin') Fancy Free," "American Made" and the unforgettable "Elvira." **MR** 

# Bobby Bare To Receive Frances Williams Preston Mentor Award

Country Music Hall of Famer **Bobby Bare** will be honored with the Frances Williams Preston Mentor Award at the upcoming Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame (NaSHOF) Gala on Oct. 11.

During his 60-year career, Bare has recorded more than 300 songs – including 35 top 40 singles – written or co-written by 76 NaSHOF songwriters – roughly 30 percent of the Hall's entire membership. He is a 2013 inductee into the Country Music Hall of Fame, and was a member of the Grand Ole Opry from 1970-1973 and has been again since 2018. He becomes the first recording artist to receive the award named for **Frances Williams Preston**, who influenced and nurtured the careers of thousands of songwriters, performers and publishers in all genres during her five-decade career at BMI.

Previous Frances Williams Preston Mentor Award recipients are music publisher **Bob Beckham** (2008), music publisher **Bill Hall** (2009), Preston (2010), music publisher **David Conrad** (2011), music publisher **Donna Hilley** (2012), Bluebird Café founder **Amy Kurland** (2013), music publisher **Pat Higdon** (2014), music publisher **Bill Lowery** (2016) and songwriter advocate **Ralph Murphy** (2019). *MR*
